# The Musées de la Civilisation de Québec to be honoured in Ottawa for their exhibition dedicated to Aboriginal peoples

Inaugurated in November 2013, *This Is Our Story: First Nations and Inuit in the 21st Century*, is the latest addition to the *Musées de la Civilisation de Québec's* (MCQ) permanent exhibits. This ambitious project offers a contemporary vision of the cultural diversity and Aboriginal realities within Quebec. Using a resolutely contemporary approach, based on a concept by Yves Sioui Durand, the exhibition reflects on what it means to be Aboriginal in today's world. It focuses on understanding the worldview of Aboriginal peoples, their relationships, and current issues, as well as methods of cultural affirmation. More than 475 objects – mainly drawn from the MCQ's collections – large-screen projections, unpublished audiovisual documentation, and contemporary works, created especially for the exhibition by such renowned Aboriginal artists as Lydia Mestokosho-Paradis, Jacques Newashish and Hannah Claus, open a dialogue with the visitor. An impressively evocative story written by young Aboriginal author Naomi Fontaine is broadcast via six audio terminals along the exhibition route, in collaboration with La Boîte Rouge vif and Alliance design et culture matérielle

For their innovative and inspirational project that redefined the meaning of the term "living history," the *Musées de la Civilisation de Québec* is the recipient of the 2014 Governor General's History Award for Excellence in Museums: History Alive! The 2014 Governor General's History Awards will be presented at a ceremony at Rideau Hall on November 3, 2014.

The Manitoba Museum's project *Bridging Generations Educational Kit* was also a finalist for this prize.

"Canadian museums contribute to a better understanding of the history and heritage of our country. It is therefore important to promote these cultural institutions," said John G. McAvity, executive director of the CMA. "That is why the CMA would like to highlight innovative projects that redefine the essence of living history, like that of the *Musées de la Civilisation de Québec*."

The Governor General's History Award brings together students, teachers, historians, museum representatives and community organizations, authors, and producers to celebrate, but also to learn by connecting with each other.
